Dear Bloomfield families.

I know it has been a long time since we've been together. This has been a big change for all of us and quite unexpected. As Superintendent Brent Colbry has already shared, "On April 9th the MSAD54 School board voted, in light of the Commissioner of Education and Governor's recommendation, to have our schools move to remote learning for the remainder of the 2019-20 school year." Superintendent Colbry stated, "Should guidance from the State or CDC change we will certainly revisit our plans and keep you informed." Even though we can't be in the same place, we can continue to connect through phone calls, email, Seesaw, ClassDojo, Google Classroom and Zoom. We'd like to hear from or see each of you at least once a week so that we know you are doing well and getting the things that you need. We know that not every family has internet service and/or a device to use. There is hope that the Maine Department of Education will have a solution for this in the next few weeks. If you have internet but no device, please give me a call at 474-6221 and I will try to work with you.

We are on our  $3^{rd}$  round of packets, each being two weeks, which have covered the following dates: March 23 – April 5 - Packet 1 April 6 – 19 – Packet 2 April Vacation (20-24) April 27 – May 10 – Packet 3

Future Packet Distribution Dates: May 11 – Packet 4 May 26 (Memorial day is 5/25) – Packet 5

Keep in mind that the packets are called level 1 learning. Level 1 packets are paper-based and general across a school or for the district grade-level. The materials have been reviewed by coaches and classroom teachers to provide review, and some new learning opportunities. Level 2 learning opportunities include assignments that are posted through email, Seesaw, ClassDojo, Google Classroom and/or Zoom. Teachers continue to plan and provide mini-lessons, share books, and other resources. These opportunities are designed to be engaging and more personal to your child's classroom or individual level of experience. We would like all families to participate, but recognize that families are all in different places.

Our district priority is to provide as many opportunities for learning as possible, in a variety of formats. We hope this helps provide equity while we work to move students forward in their learning.

It has been wonderful to see some of your faces on Zoom meetings with your teachers. Starting this week every classroom teacher is scheduling at least one Zoom or other meeting to be able to see you, and for you to be able to see and talk with your classmates.
