The simplest and most effective way to be involved is to make sure your child gets a **good night sleep**, has a **healthy snack**, and **brings important things back and forth** between school and home. Other ways to be involved are:

- Making sure your child comes to school every day and on-time
- Volunteering time at home to prepare materials
- Volunteering time in your child's classroom, lunchroom, playground, library or school if vaccinated and willing to wear a mask indoors
- Attending open houses and special events
- Attending parent-teacher conferences (held in November)
- Communicating with your child's teacher through phone, e-mail, SeeSaw, Class Dojo or face-to-face (after school hours at 2:30 or after)
- Attending monthly parent group or Parent-Teacher Group (PTG) meetings on the first Tuesday of the month at 5:00 via Zoom until further notice. The first meeting is Tuesday, September 7.

We are required to get the **RSU MSAD 54 Parent/Guardian Economically Disadvantaged Survey 2021-2022** (purple form) from every family. By completing the form, you help our school qualify for funding and ensure that all students will continue to receive a free breakfast and lunch.

Additional information:

- Instructional Hours will be 8:15 AM to 2:15 PM daily
- Parent Drop Off Hours will be from 7:45-8:15 AM
- Parent Pick Up will be from 2:12 PM to 2:30 PM daily
- Students and staff are not currently required to maintain social distancing but some distancing during breakfast, snack and lunch will be maintained when possible.
- Student drop-off will be at the front door at no earlier than 7:45. For the safety of your child only drop when there is a greeter present at the door.
- Student pick-up will be outside at the cafeteria entrance to the building, as it was for most of the 2020-2021 school year. You will have a pick-up poster with your child's name or picture starting next week.
- Students will not have to remain in strict cohorts but some cohorts for lunch and recess, to reduce the need for quarantining large groups, will be maintained.


It's going to be a great year of learning. I know that "we can" do great things together.
